ARE YOU PREPARED: 100 Feet of Defensible Space is the Law

In January 2005 a state law became effective that extended the defensible space clearance around homes and structures from 30 feet to 100 feet. Proper clearance to 100 feet dramatically increases the chance of your house surviving a wildfire. This defensible space also provides for firefighter safety when protecting homes during a wildland fire. Visit: www.fire.ca.gov (Cal Fire) for LOTS of information to prepare your family and home for what looks to be a very dangerous summer fire season.

If property is along a road, clearing maintenance is also highly recommended. *Precaution steps = safe families.*
